

Ellis Island



- In the late 1800's, the U.S. began to see a new wave of immigrants arriving in the country.
- A larger processing center for these many immigrants was needed.
- These immigrants came from different parts of Europe than those before:
 - Southern European countries like Italy and Greece
 - Eastern European countries like Russia and Poland
- Ellis Island opened in New York City harbor in 1892

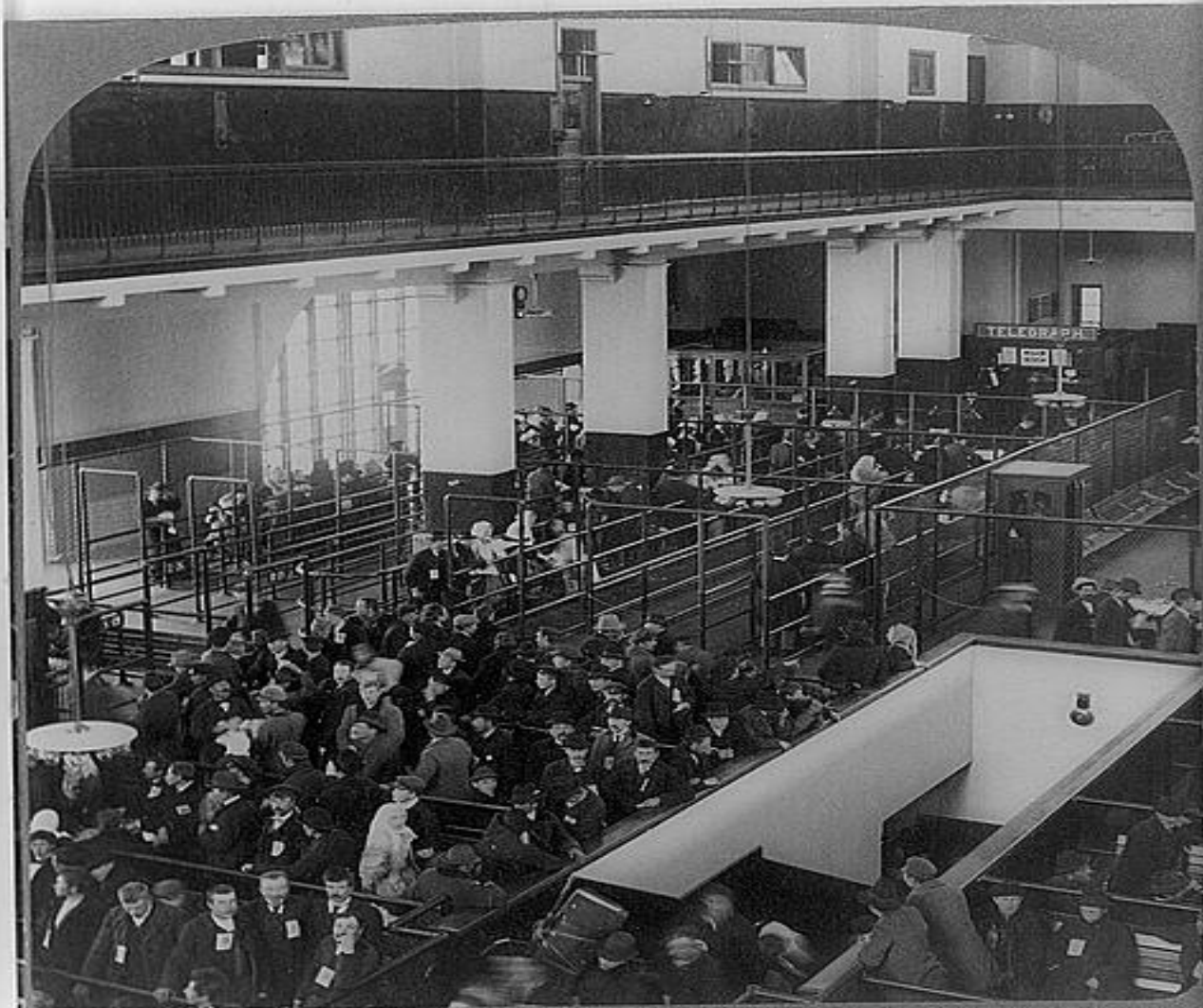

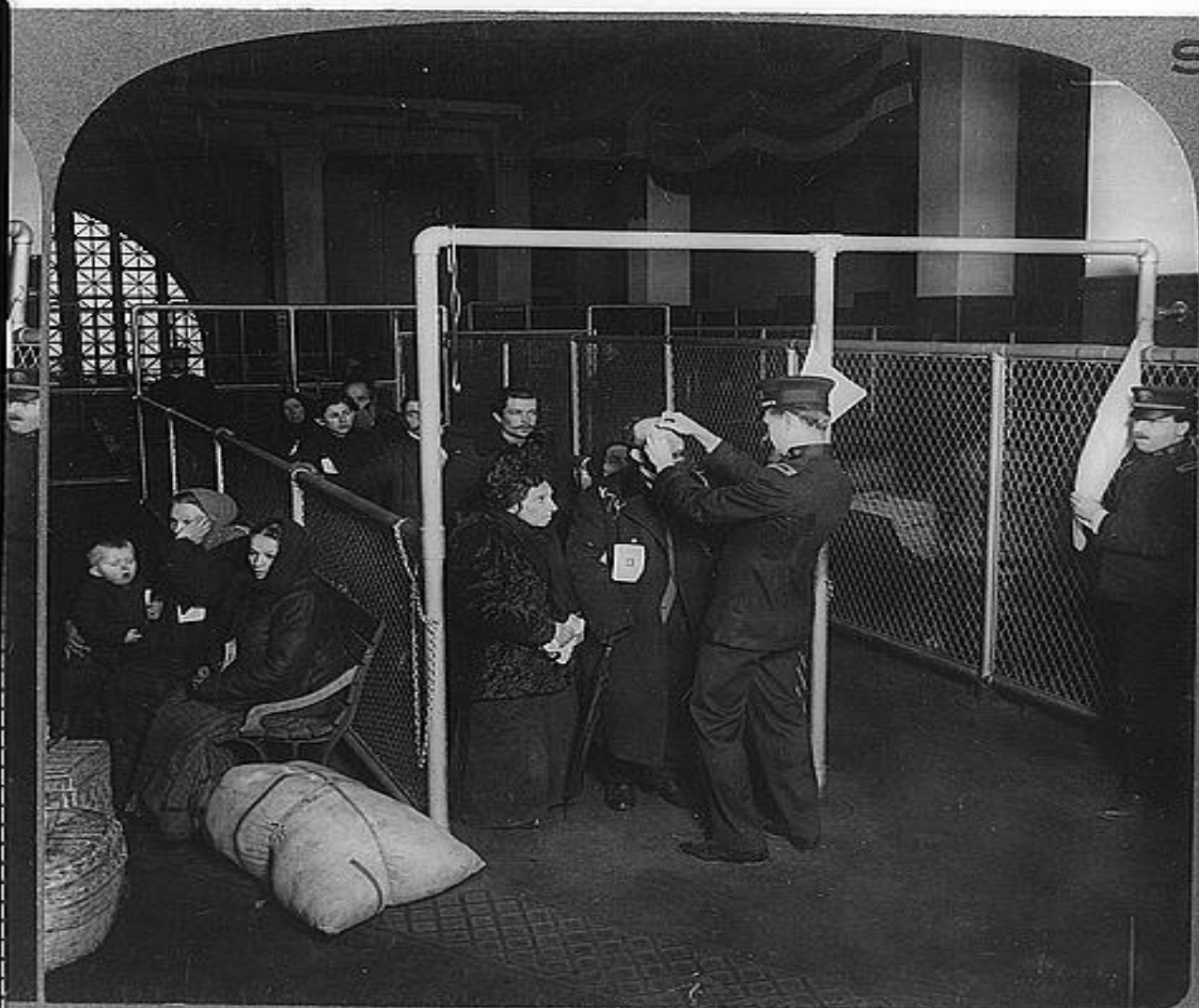

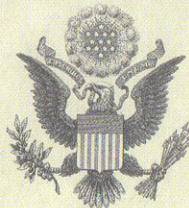

The “Ellis Island of the West”

- 1 million Asian immigrants passed through Angel Island between 1910 and 1940
- Located in San Francisco Bay

- Between 1892 and 1954 (when it closed), more than 12 million immigrants passed through Ellis Island
- Today, over 100 million Americans (more than 1/3 of the country!) can trace their ancestry to these immigrants.



- Presented to the U.S. by France in 1886
- Stands on an island very near Ellis Island
- One of the first images that immigrants had of the U.S.

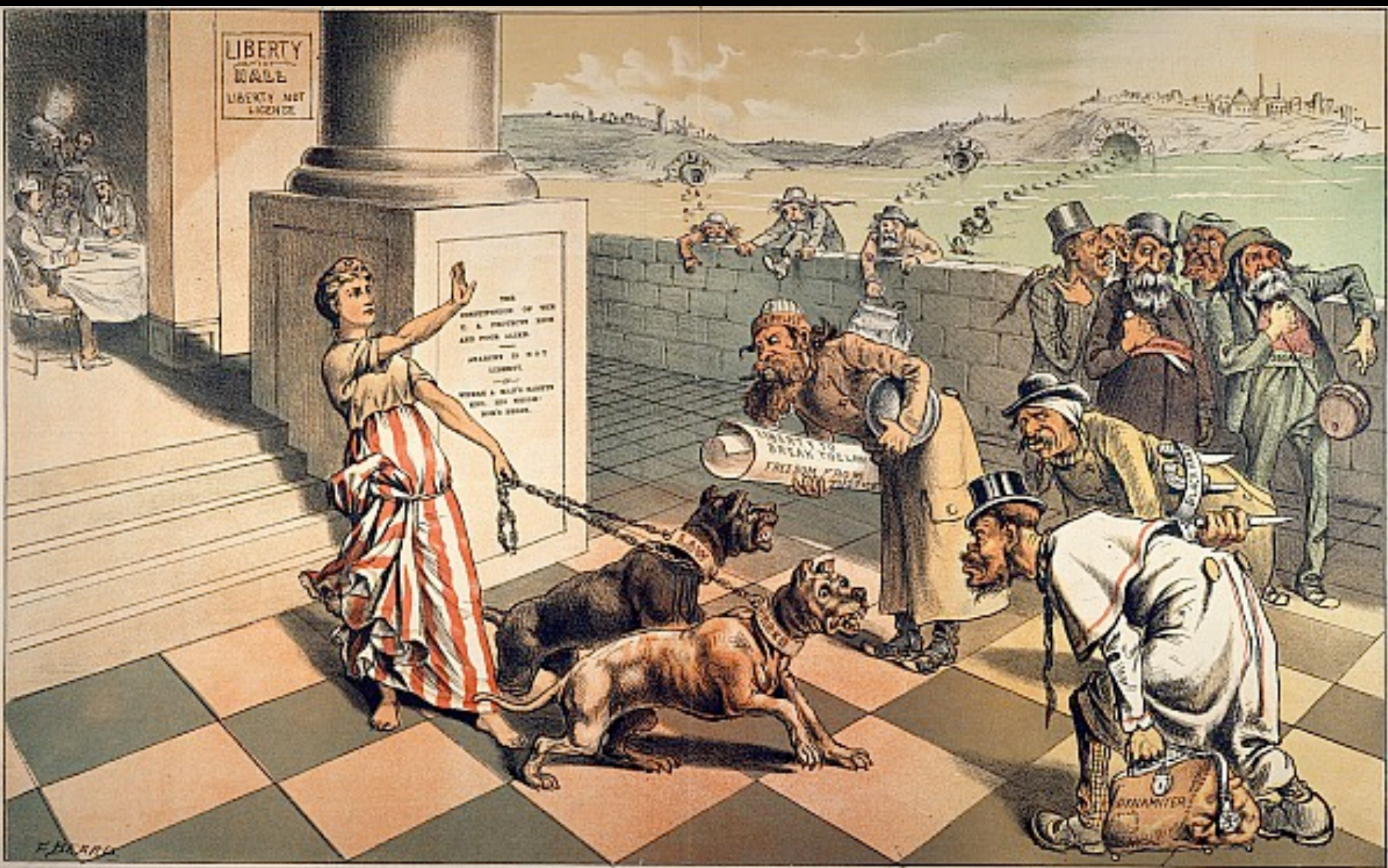
