Revolutionary Bingo Clues

1. Government power that abuses the individual rights of citizens - **tyranny**
2. Among other things, this law closed the port of Boston for all business - **Intolerable Acts**
3. These people were opposed to separation from Great Britain - **Loyalists**
4. Leader of the Continental Army – **George Washington**
5. Location of the first battle of the Revolutionary War – **Lexington**
6. This form of protest used by colonists involved refusing to buy British goods – **Boycott**
7. This agreement granted the entire territory from the Atlantic Ocean to the Mississippi River, and roughly from the north border of Florida to the Great Lakes, to the newly independent United States – **Treaty of Paris (1783)**
8. The British won this war but it put them in debt – **French and Indian War**
9. An economic system in which the government controls all trade in order to generate profit – **Mercantilism**
10. Along with British Parliament, he passed laws that led to rebellion in the colonies – **King George III**
11. This major power provided the Americans with funding, training, and military assistance to help defeat Great Britain - **France**
12. Seeing the colonists as a threat to their land, many of this group of people fought on the side of the British – **Native Americans**
13. Nickname for British soldiers – **Redcoats**
14. This battle effectively ended the British plan to fight the war in the north of the colonies – **Battle of Saratoga**
15. This group was considered a terrorist organization by the British – **Sons of Liberty**
16. This law removed a tax from the British East India Company that other American importers had to pay – **Tea Act**
17. He was the chief author of the Declaration of Independence – **Thomas Jefferson**
18. This law placed a tax on all printed items – **Stamp Act**
19. These people favored separation from Great Britain – **Patriots**
20. The Declaration of Independence originally included a section that condemned *this system* as cruel and evil, but it was taken out of the final draft - **slavery**
21. This widely read pamphlet by Thomas Paine argued in favor of separation from Great Britain – **Common Sense**
22. This colonial political organization, formed following the first battles of the Revolutionary War, made the decision to declare independence from Britain – **2nd Continental Congress**
23. These mercenary soldiers from a region in modern-day Germany fought on the side of the British in the Revolutionary War - **Hessians**
24. Along with William Dawes and Samuel Prescott, he alerted colonists that the British army was marching to Concord – **Paul Revere**
25. The nickname for the Massachusetts militia – **Minutemen**
26. As a form of protests, colonists dumped 18,000 pounds of British tea into Boston Harbor – **Boston Tea Party**
27. Wars, like the Revolutionary War and the French and Indian War, often cause governments to go into this – **debt**
28. For over 100 years, these laws controlled trade in the British colonies, but weren't consistently enforced – **Navigation Acts**
29. This riot in Boston was forcefully put down by British soldiers, further angering colonists – **Boston Massacre**

- 30. There was a big advantage that the British had at the beginning of the Revolutionary War, and was one reason why French assistance helped the Americans with the war - **Navy**
- 31. He commanded the British army at the end of the Revolutionary War – **Lord Cornwallis**
- 32. The British surrendered at the final battle of the Revolutionary War – **Yorktown**
- 33. This document declared all men to be equal and gave a justification as to when it is acceptable to overthrow your government – **Declaration of Independence**
